Speed king Miller is striving to crack UK

ASH Miller is a long way from home - but the St Ives-based racing driver is hoping to become a modern-day Alan Jones and make his country proud. The 25-year-old Australian is talking to spon

sors and teams and hopes to secure a drive for coming season.

There is no doubting his confidence, that's for are. After a year chasing his dream, Miller is determined to follow in the footsteps of Jones. Australia's 1980 Formula One world champion and indeed the current Antipodean on the circuit, Mark Webber, who came over to the UK

in 1995 when he was 17. Miller said: "The United Kingdom is the hotspot globally for motorsport. It has been proved time and time again that if you want to take it anywhere, you have got to come to the UK

"As Alan Jones said, 50 per cent of the battle is actually getting over to the UK to continue your career in the first place.

It was a bit of a snap decision but one I knew had to happen if I wanted to continue racing as a career after years of racing in Australia."

Miller began racing Down Under in 2000, starting in karts and later driving production sports cars.

But it get to a certain point where I was doing some endurance racing and I wanted more out of it," he said. "It got to a watershed moment where I thought I need to make a big change if I want to continue progressing." Miller ended up in St Ives by accident. "I came over for a round of the Renault Clio

Cup at Brands Hatch. While I was here I did a couple of job trials and some instructing at Bedford Autodrome - and I met a guy at Grafham Water who said I could stay for a couple of weeks.

That was the only plan I had when I came ick and landed on his doorstep. I made it up as I went along.

Dad Graham is 60 and was born in Hertfordshire, but left the country at three weeks old because his father was a British Colonial Administrater who worked in the South Pacific,

He said: "If he hadn't gone on his own I would have kicked him out. The only way Ash could go forward with his motorsport was to come ver here. We had got as far as we could in Australia and we were stagnating as far as any forward movements were concerned.

The opportunities here are far wider and you can get much more experience here than you can back home.

He added: "It's always great coming back." Hopefally, next time, it will be to see his son tacing on the national circuit







Ash has other 'not so hidden' talents

ASH Miller is full of surprises certainly you wouldn't expect a racing driver to also be an Irish dancing champion! "Here's a bit of info on the dancing," said the 25-year-old

Australian when I emailed him for details. "I started dancing in 1996

and my career has spanned from then until my last competition in July 2011.

He even finished 11th in the 2007 World Championships. He has toured the Baltics and Taiwan wth Gaelforce Dance and is heading back out on tour to Russia for a couple of weeks, just before the new motor racing season starts. Anything else? Yes. Miller is

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Aussie aiming to chase Clio Cup dream

After a taste of international motorsport, Queenslander Ash Miller is on a quest to pursue a motorsport career in the United Kingdom.

Having competed in the AirAsia Clio Cup at the final round at Brands Hatch earlier this month, the 20-year-old is planning to move to the UK in February to try and sure up a full season in the competitive Clio Cup.

"There's no two ways about it. You have to live over there," Miller told Speedcafe.com.

"To be right in there with people who have been there and done that, it's the only way to make progress. Half the battle is getting over there, and thats what I'm committed to."

Miller plans to compete in a full Clio Cup series, which is part of the BTCC support category bill, receiving live television.

Speaking on his debut in the class at Brands, where he was the only international driver competing, he says the class is very challenging.

"The pack was so competitive, and fighting back through the experienced guys was an awesome challenge," he said.

"They definitely know what they're doing, so you have to use a bit of creative driving to tackle them, was a great experience and a fantastic learning curve."

Driving for Scuderia Vittoria in the 19-car races, Miller finished 12th and 13th in his maiden drives.

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Aussie aims for international race debut

Queensland state-based racer Ashley Miller is on the brink of realising a dream.

The 20-year-old has been offered a drive in the popular Britcar 24 Hour at Silverstone this October, and is desperately searching for budget to secure the position.

The Queensland Production Sports Cars driver has been invited to compete with Prestige Racing in a one-make championshipwinning SEAT Cupra.

"They've asked me if I'd like to compete," Miller told Speedcafe.com.

"The only thing that is holding me back at this stage is the funds.

"I've secured about a third of the funds. It's a huge opportunity which has opened up and I'm trying my best to fulfil the opportunity. The team is pretty keen to get me over there.

"It's an achievable goal to get into this race. I have a goal of racing in the UK full-time, and this is a huge step towards realising that. My vision is to keep racing over there."

Besides competing in state-based racing competition, Miller is the retail manager of the Revolution Racegear store in Springwood, Brisbane.

The Britcar 24 Hour race is the only 24 Hour race for GT and saloon cars in the UK. Other Australian entrants already secured on the grid at the event is Ryan McLeod's Holden Astra entry.
